FREDERICK AMERICAN LITTLE LEAGUE

"Where Childhood Dreams...
Become Lifetime Memories."

Our motto was inspired by a speech given by Marguerite "Weetzie" Colliflower the wife of the founding coach in the league (1954) John Richard "Dick" Colliflower (both pictured



here). Our former first lady of F.A.L.L. spoke these words during our 50th Anniversary celebration. She also emphasized these are the years you spend the most time together as a family and the kids should always come first! I have had many conversations with her family and other F.A.L.L. alumni in our community. The experiences from their little league days stay with them for many years. As a league, we strive to win but we also strive to create these important positive memories and even more, so we keep our mission close to our hearts, so our young players grow up to be good people.

The framework to reach that goal is critical. So, we train and practice the double-goal coach philosophy, as the term implies, has two goals. Winning comes first. But the second — and more important — goal is instilling lessons of teamwork, perseverance, sports-

manship, empathy, work ethic and other critical life skills through what happens on the baseball field.

Frederick American Little League is growing, and our board of directors worked hard in the fall of 2022 and early 2023 to revise our manager and coach selection process to find leaders and train them to practice and demonstrate the 2-goal philosophy as well as the 3 pillars of Little League Baseball:

Character Courage Loyalty

Our mission and philosophy begin with our adult volunteers. We want our coaches and players to compete and win but not at all costs. Instead, we know



with the right training those wins will come but we also want our children to win in school, with their families and friends within the league, and outside the league. Finally, as they become adults and move through life into their future careers, the lessons from their little league years will prove valuable in the workplace competing for promotions and being a team player in their jobs.

I have always said that regardless of what the score board displays, what my players in Frederick American display is excellent sportsmanship. How will we know when this happens?

Recently a parent of an opponent in our district took the time to send me an email and I honestly cannot recall if we won or lost. But the words of that parent will stay with me for a lifetime. It reinforces that the leaders in F.A.L.L. are moving in the right direction:

Hey there! It was great to meet you guys today!

I just wanted to take a moment and let you know how impressed we were with your team's sportsmanship. We heard their Brunswick cheer, and when I was heading back to my car one of your players reached out to shake my hand and thanked me for coming to your field. Y'all are doing things right!
