In May, the BHCA signed a charter agreement to sponsor the Braddock Cub Scout Pack 278. We completed the 2020-2021 fiscal year in the black thanks to the very conservative tactics taken by our Facilities and Pool Committees and the generosity of our pool members who paid dues this year.

We held an *in-person* annual General Membership meeting at the community center this November. Thank-you to Tom Dixon for arranging pizza and refreshments. BRADDOCK BOY SCOUT TROOP 278


oy Scout Troop 278 meets on Thursday nights at Camp Baker. Officially the troop has been registered with the Boy Scouts of America since 1973 but has been in existence since 1955. Camp Holmes D. Baker was donated by the Baker family of Frederick to the Youth of Frederick County. Troop 278 canvases Braddock Heights every November to collect donations for Scouting For Food, benefitting the Middletown Food Bank. Thanks to Braddock residents, these Scouts, as well as others in the Middletown Valley, collected roughly 1,300 pounds of food this year. Once a month the boys help pack food backpacks for needy children in the community through Middletown United Methodist Church (MUMC), their sponsor.

Two Eagle Scout projects were completed this year. Each young man led useful projects at

MUMC. There is now a gaga pit and an education center near the church pavilion on their property. Training leaders and community service are important parts of Scouting.

The boys also participate in various outdoor activities usually with an emphasis on skills that help them advance ranks and encourage leadership. The first half of the New Year will focus on hiking as many of the boys and leaders will be preparing for a ten-day hike in New Mexico in late June. They do monthly campouts, go on bike rides, and attend a week-long summer camp. Twice a year the troop cleans up Camp Baker to keep the property from becoming overgrown.
