spoke for a few minutes to give an update on the ongoing research and planning for the Braddock Heights Village. The group attending FYF decided that inside gatherings were now acceptable. The Health and Mobility team will explore services that can be provided safely.

The 2023 season will get under way real soon. Registration will open on our website in mid-December. We'll jump right into the indoor training program during the winter months. F.A.L.L. uses The Athlete Factory as our indoor training site. Our team assignments happen in March and then teams start practicing as they prepare for opening day in April. The spring season runs through July with a regular season, all-stars, and invitational tournament season. In mid-August we get a small break until our fall season begins in September.

The most common question we get is when will the new fence be up? So here is what's going on with the fence. When covid hit our baseball season a few years ago we opted to hold on building a new wall until we got our hands around what the future was going to be for our league and Little League in general. Sponsorships were frozen and the league persevered by operating a modified (but actually) longer season with 4 teams running from July 1 to end of October. The kids were simply ecstatic to be out of the house. Since then, we have watched the cost of lumber skyrocket. Our latest quote was nearly 3x what our original quote was to put the fence up. During that same time period we worked really hard at fundraising and have explored other types of outfield walls. We are gathering information now on something that could be very unique in this area and will last many, many years at Braddock Height field.
